A CHRISTIAN OBLIGATION

Romans 1:14-16: "I am a debtor both to Greeks and barbarians, both to wise and unintelligent. So, for my part, I am eager to preach the good news to you also who are in Rome. For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek."

Three times in Romans 1:14-16, the Apostle Paul uses the words "*I am*," and each time carries an important message for every true believer in Christ.

1. I am a debtor

He says in verse 14: *"I AM A DEBTOR"* – debtor to all men, to tell them about the saving work of Christ.

But why was *he* indebted to people he had never even seen?

For several reasons:

1.1. He knew the answer how to be saved from the penalty and power of sin.

He had in his hand what they needed to be saved from the penalty and power of sin. If I see a drunkard lying across the railroad track and I do nothing about it, am I not a murderer if he is killed by the train? If I see a man drowning and I have a life buoy in my hand but do not throw it to him, am I not a murderer if he goes down for the last time? If I see millions of lost souls about me and, knowing the message of salvation, do not tell them, am I not guilty if they die without Christ?

<u>1.2. He knew that the Christ who had died</u> for his sins has also died for the sins of others.

Further, Paul felt himself a debtor to others, because the Christ who had died for his sins has **also** died for the sins of others. As he says in 2 Corinthians 5:15: "... and He (Christ) died for all, that they who live should no longer live to themselves, but to Him Who died for them and has been raised."

<u>1.3. He knew that the Christ who had died</u> for his sins, had commissioned him to tell others of His saving grace.

Finally, the Christ who had died for Paul's sins had **commissioned** him to tell others of His saving grace. Thus he says in 1 Corinthians 9:16,17: *"…for it is woe to me if I should not announce the glad tidings.* For … I am entrusted with an administration."

2. I am eager

Paul could say further what every true believer should be able to say: Not, "I am a debtor, *but*," but rather, "I am a debtor ... SO, for my part, I AM EAGER" (Romans 1:15). He was eager to discharge his debt because he had that with which to discharge it — the wonderful "gospel of the grace of God." And he did indeed make this message known to others with all that was in him.

3. I am not ashamed

And now the third "I am": I am a debtor ... so, ... I am eager ... For I AM NOT ASHAMED of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes,..." (verse 16).

So we see that the Apostle Paul was always proud to own Christ as the mighty Saviour from sin. And he instructs us in 1 Corinthians 11:1 to be imitators of him: *"Be my imitators, even as I also [am] of Christ."*

How about you?

Do you know Christ as **your** personal Saviour from hades (the present hell)?

And if you do, do you tell others about Him?
